WARD NEWS FOR JANUARY 2014

January crime levels below average

34 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in January 2014. The average monthly total is around 43. 17 of these crimes were in Brigg town, including 4 assaults, 12 incidents of theft, and 1 case of criminal damage.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during January 2014

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In January 2014, 152 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property	15
Concerns about individuals and safety	21
Concerns about behaviour	61
Concerns about traffic	55

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

REPORTS FOR JANUARY 2014 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in January 2014

17 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month made up of:

- 1 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 2 x Aggravated vehicle taking
- 1 x Theft from the person
- 1 x Theft in a dwelling
- 3 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 1 x Theft from a shop
- 3 x Theft of a motor vehicle and TWOC
- 1 x Assault on a constable
- 2 x Common assault & Battery
- 1 x Interference with a motor vehicle

1 x Criminal damage (to property)

A total of 79 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in December, including:

- 15 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 10 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 8 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour (4 calls regarding noise nuisance related to the same location)
- 18 traffic related matters
- 10 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

No recorded crimes in January 2014

Police were called on three occasions regarding inconsiderate parking outside the school. Three other traffic issues were also reported including a minor collision. A suspected burglary proved to be a false alarm.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in January 2014

- 1 x Making off without paying (at Barnetby Top Services)
- 1 x Theft (other)

In addition to 15 traffic related issues, Police were called to a domestic incident and after a sighting of possible hare coursers.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in January 2014

- 1 x Putting people in fear of violence
- 2 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Production of a cannabis plant
- 1 x Possessing controlled drug etc
- 4 x Criminal damage (to property)

Police were called on 22 other occasions, 10 of which involved highway disruption or alleged traffic offences. Five calls concerned domestic issues.

Bonby

No recorded crimes in January 2014

Police were called to a crashed vehicle. A caller also reported concerns for an individual's safety.

Worlaby

Recorded crimes in January 2014

1 x Common assault and battery

Police were called to a vehicle in a ditch, and also to a domestic incident. Three calls from the same location regarding the safety of individuals all proved to be false alarms.

Saxby All Saints

Recorded crimes in January 2014

1 x Burglary in a dwelling
1 x Threats to kill

The two recorded crimes were at the same address – to which police were called on two other occasions because of serious domestic tensions.

Horkstow

Recorded crimes in January 2014

1 x Burglary not in a dwelling

No other matters required police attention.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in January 2014

1 x Criminal damage
1 x Theft (other)

Both offences were at the same address – unoccupied since the floods.

Police were called on 14 other occasions. Two road traffic incidents were reported. Six callers reported suspicious vehicles. Four other calls concerned the safety of individuals.

Melton Ross and New Barnetby

No recorded crimes in January 2014

Police received two reports of highway disruption. An individual was also reported missing.
