Crime total in February back up to average level

43 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in February 2015, of which 30 were in Brigg town. The average monthly total is around 43. Across the Ward, there were 17 incidences of theft, and 6 of burglary (none in a dwelling). There were 12 incidents of varying degrees of assault (10 in Brigg), and five involving criminal damage.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during February 2015

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In February 2015, 119 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows – $\,$

Concerns about property	10
Concerns about individuals and safety	16
Concerns about behaviour	
Concerns about traffic	37

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

REPORTS FOR FEBRUARY 2015 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in February 2015

30 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month - made up of:

- 1 x Wounding with intent to do GBH
- 2 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 5 x Other burglary in a building other than a dwelling
- 1 x Theft in a dwelling
- 3 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 3 x Theft from shops and stalls
- 2 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Making off without paying
- 7 x Common assault & Battery
- 1 x Interference with a motor vehicle
- 4 x Criminal damage

A total of 63 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in February, including:

- 20 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 9 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 1 sudden death
- 3 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 10 traffic related matters
- 2 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in February 2015

1 x Theft from a motor vehicle (s 2 x Theft (other)

(syphoning fuel)

Police were called by people concerned for the safety of two individuals. Police attended a road traffic collision on the motorway. A caller also gave details of vehicles causing obstruction in the village.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in February 2015

1 x Interference with a vehicle

(on the Industrial Estate)

In the village a lorry got into difficulties trying to turn round. Elsewhere Police were called to six traffic related incidents. Police were also called twice about the safety of an individual walking alongside the A15.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in February 2015

- 1 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Common assault & Battery
- 1 x Criminal damage

Police were called on 21 other occasions, 13 of which involved traffic collisions, highway disruption or alleged traffic offences – all but one on the motorway or A180. Other matters dealt with by the police included a drunken individual causing trouble in a local pub, a concern for an individual's safety, a rowdy group in the street, and a sudden death.

Bonby

No recorded crimes in February 2015

Police were called on three occasions to the same address over domestic issues, and a car driver reported that a bus driver had been abusive.

Worlaby

Recorded crimes in February 2015

1 x Burglary not in a dwelling 1 x Theft (other)


Two suspicious incidents were reported – all in order.

1 x Common assault and battery

Recorded crimes in February 2015

3 x Theft (other)

Two road traffic offences were reported. A caller also reported two other suspicious incidents.

Melton Ross and New Barnetby
